

Vehicle Wrap Guidelines:

When we do a complete vehicle wrap we require that our installers perform a site inspection of your vehicle. The installer will measure your vehicle, take digital pictures, and make note of any door handles, gas caps, trim molding, and other objects that could hinder the readability of graphics. We will also make note of any vehicle damage, rust, or plastic areas where graphics may not stick well.

The big challenges of vehicle graphics are that there are many curves and obstacles on a vehicle and the installation process is not a perfect science. The vinyl can stretch as it is applied to the vehicle, and items do not always fall exactly as you might anticipate. Thus, we advise that you do not place any critical elements (text, logos, critical imagery) within 4" of the top, bottom front or back of the vehicle or of wheel wells, license plate, door handles, reflectors, and other objects that are noted on our templates.

When text placement is critical or needs to be closer than 4" to obstacles stated above, we will often suggest text be done using cut vinyl, which will ensure a much more accurate placement.

Before the vehicle is dropped of at our facility for the installation process, we request that you remove all valuables (electronics, CD's, fishing rods, phones, chargers, etc) and that you lock the glove box, console, or other storage compartments.

Upon completion of the installation, the vehicle should not be washed for at least 72 hours. You can run it through touchless car washes or hand wash it. We do not recommend that you power wash your wrap and you should not use wax on your wrap. Window cleaner works well to touch up spots on your vehicle wrap.

NEVER use gasoline, diesel, citrus cleaners, bug remover, tar remover, glue remover, brushes or abrasives on your wrapped vehicle. They may damage your wrap and will void the warranty.
